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Striking out for fun in science

A SCIENCE stunt filmed in Woodville is in a hi-tech plan to inspire primary school students nationwide.

The pilot episode of *Awesome Science** (**Guaranteed*) will be a world-first in science communication, screened on smart whiteboards.

Enabled Solutions technical director Grant Hull says the boards can be made to work like a giant iPhone. "It's like a big touchscreen," he said. "All the kids can see it, the teacher can see it.

"They can watch movies, move things around and play interactive games."

Presenter Dr Paul Crocker, from That Science Gang, and colleague Nat Scherer put their heads in the path of a bowling ball to explain the physics of a pendulum in an excerpt made with the SA Film Corporation and Royal Institution of Australia

"It's mostly about presenting science in a fun way so kids are interested in what they're seeing," he said.
